

\$125,000 to Tackle Rural Hawaii's Nursing Shortage

The William Randolph Hearst Foundations has awarded \$125,000 to UH Manoa Nursing to fund scholarships for 15 community college students from rural areas of Hawaii pursuing a baccalaureate degree in nursing.

UH Manoa Nursing Dean Mary G. Boland said "The Hearst Foundation BS Nursing Scholarship Program gives nurses in rural areas of Hawaii the funds they need to pursue education beyond the community college level. Having BS prepared nurses throughout our rural communities is essential in ensuring our residents have access to quality health care."

Nursing education programs at Maui College, Kauai Community

College and UH Manoa worked together to increase access to baccalaureate nursing education in Hawaii by transforming the educational environment. Together, faculties developed one curriculum, academic standards, student learning outcomes, and nursing courses culminating into the UH Hawaii Statewide Nursing Consortium (HSNC). HSNC offers a BS degree in nursing with innovative, integrated learning opportunities for nursing students throughout the state, regardless of their island of residence. During the first three years, the curriculum is identical at the community colleges and UH Manoa, with seamless transition for students into the fourth (final) year offered through UH Manoa on Oahu or via distance for Maui and Kauai students.

From 2013-2016, 81 students from Maui College and Kauai Community College earned the BS degree from UH Manoa via the HSNC pathway.

Due to the generosity of the Hearst Scholarship, 24 students received financial support. UH Manoa Nursing matched \$50,000 to further support student success. This new funding will provide 15 additional scholarships for community college students.
