On Friday, April 27, 2018, Carolyn Constantin, PhD, RNC, Associate Professor, was awarded the Regents' Medal for Excellence in Teaching by the Board of Regents as tribute to faculty members who exhibit an extraordinary level of subject mastery and scholarship, teaching effectiveness and creativity and personal values that benefit students.
