College-Level Exam Program Option

College-Level Exam Program (CLEP) exams are a viable option for satisfying course requirements of the Bachelor of Science in nursing programs. Applicants to and students of a Nancy Atmospera-Walch School of Nursing (NAWSON) undergraduate nursing program must consult with a NAWSON Office of Students

Services advisor regarding the use and limitations of non-graded course equivalencies to meet current graduation requirements. Students who successfully pass a CLEP exam will be awarded college credit toward a Bachelor of Science in nursing degree and, therefore, will not need to take the respective required coursework.

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UH Manoa Transcript Requests

Students who wish to request official UH Manoa transcripts must visit the UH Manoa Office of the Registrar.

The Office of the Registrar does not produce unofficial transcripts. Current students can view and print their academic record in MyUH via STAR Degree Check/View Transcript.
